Red Class

Red Class have settled into the class wonderfully this week and have made a fantastic start to the new term! We have been enjoying our circus story, with pupils engaging enthusiastically in the different activities and sensory experiences linked to the theme. We have also been developing our physical awareness and movement through our Physibods programme. Pupils have enjoyed exploring different stretches and movements, supporting them to become more aware of their bodies and movement.



Yellow Class

It's been an exciting week in Yellow Class. We've welcomed some new faces who have settled into the routine wonderfully. We've also welcomed some caterpillars which have now turned themselves into chrysalises. The pupils were fascinated looking at the caterpillars in the jar and have been learning about their lifecycle and habitat.



Dragonfly Class

This week, Dragonfly Class learnt about London through a range of activities. The children participated in a shared reading activity with the book '*Lost in London*', exploring props related to well-known landmarks. They also enjoyed their sensory cooking lesson, where they made sandwiches with their chosen fillings and initiated movement with their hands on different sensory ingredients during the mark-making session.



Pink Class

This week in Pink Class, the children have enjoyed developing their fine motor skills during mark making. They have particularly enjoyed using their hands, fingers and cars during the different sensory activities. We used soap and glitter in plastic sleeves to make marks on the tables. The children enjoyed watching the glitter move when they pressed on the plastic.



Blue Class

This week in Blue Class, we started our 'Paddington Bear' sensory story. The children really enjoyed taking part in the story and exploring lots of different sensory experiences. The children enjoyed touching and exploring Paddington Bear, feeling his soft fur. They also enjoyed touching the jam and feeling how sticky it was, as well as exploring the straw hat and feeling its texture. The children enjoyed using their hands to explore the different things in the story.



Orange Class

This week, Orange Class have been working hard by balancing, climbing and walking across apparatus during our P.E lessons. We have enjoyed working on different parts of the course and using the help of familiar adults when we needed to. We have also focused on grouping and matching colours.



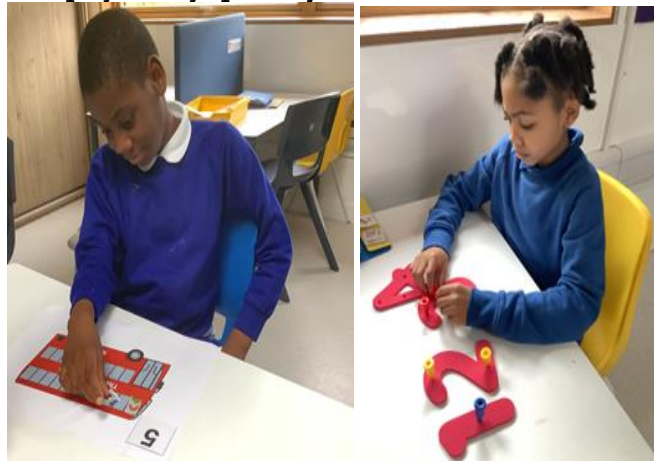
Bumblebee Class

Gold Class

Gold Class have been focusing on early mathematical development by engaging in practical activities around number-value and recognition. The pupils have been actively matching passenger figures to a bus according to specific number symbols. The pupils developed their fine motor strength and mathematical understanding by placing corresponding pegs onto number cutouts, allowing them to visually and physically quantify each numerical value.



Green Class

This week, Green Class have enjoyed taking part in lots of exciting new activities. During our sensory sessions, we explored a variety of new and interesting objects. One of our favourite discoveries was using CDs! Everyone was fascinated by their shiny, reflective surfaces and enjoyed exploring how they looked as they moved them and caught the light. We also enjoyed getting creative by decorating letters using green glitter, card, tissue paper and paint. We had lots of opportunities to explore the different colours, textures and materials while creating our own colourful designs.



Rainbow Class

Last week we enjoyed returning to Elm Court for our steel pan sessions, we learnt and memorised a short rhythm to play as part of a group and put this all together to play part of a song. In P.E. we have been starting our topic of Gymnastics. We have been working on holding a balance.



Purple Class

Purple Class pupils have settled into their new surroundings brilliantly and are enjoying getting to know each other. This week the pupils were able to count and match the number and represent the quantity using a range of fun concrete resources!



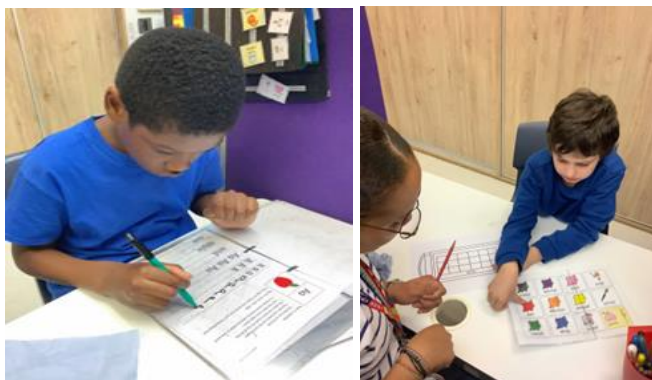
Butterfly Class

The children have been given opportunities to move around the school, practise taking independent steps, and develop weight-bearing and movement skills while supported in the hoist.



Silver Class

This week in Silver Class, our pupils have been focusing on engaging in a range of activities to develop their communication, independence and fine motor skills. During our handwriting and letter formation activities, the children practised forming letters and developing their pencil control. In our art lesson, they used different communication systems to express their preferences and make choices about the activities they wanted to take part in. These activities supported our pupils to develop their ability to engage in tasks, communicate their preferences and build confidence in expressing themselves.



Unicorn Class

This week in Unicorn Class we have been using the Chromebooks to research how to get to famous London landmarks from The Livity School. We have been using the TFL website to plan the best route. We have also been working on using descriptive language and writing full sentences with plenty of adjectives.
