#### Red Class

This week, Red Class children have continued to awaken the senses and make choices, decisions and begun to develop a preference. The children tasted different flavours of their own choice and begun to gain an understanding of the world around them. Furthermore, the children played with toys that lighted up and were very fascinated and interested in how the colours changed.



#### Yellow Class

Yellow Class children this week have been choosing their favourites toys and activities to use using different communication methods such as photos, objects or CENMAC devices. They also did many activities in the Rainforest themed sensory room in the class, where they had the opportunity to smell different scents and products related to America.



#### Pink Class

We had a great time dressing up for World Book Day at the end of last week in Pink Class! This week we enjoyed touching and playing

with the cold snow and even incorporated it into our sensory story; 'Be Brave, Little Penguin'. In My Thinking we've been working hard at making patterns and grouping objects.



#### Blue Class

This week Blue Class has been working on Zones of Regulations. The pupils learned during the lesson the "anger" feeling, identified by the red coloured objects and facial expressions. At their work stations they practised how to identify their anger feeling looking in the mirror. After that we came back to the "Green Zone" – calm - where they were able to experience the opposite feeling and get more relaxed.



## Orange Class

In Orange Class this week, during our Maths session focusing on 2D shapes, pupils were encouraged to follow instructions to recognise shapes and colours. They worked very well and were able to show that they have embedded what we have been learning so far.



## Ladybird Class

So far this week, Ladybirds Class have enjoyed making 'microwave mud cake'. The children tasted raspberries, strawberries and raisins and communicated for their favourites to add to the cake mixture. We used our symbols to share how the mixture changed as it cooked. We also explored colour mixing by using felt pens to decorate coffee filter paper. We then sprayed it with water to see the colours change.



## Rainbow Class

Last week, children in Rainbow Class celebrated World Book Day. Children in the class dressed up and joined in on reading activities. This past week, children were working on Spanish and linking this to the kitchen environment, where we toasted bagels. Children learned Spanish words such as 'toastadora' (toaster), 'pan' (bread) and 'cuchillo' (knife). We also helped our school community by delivering fruit to all the classes in school.



## Green Class

Children in Green Class this week enjoyed making raw flapjacks. They enjoyed feeling, tasting, pouring and mixing the different ingredients together.



## Purple Class

Purple Class have been using their culinary expertise with making homemade pizzas with cheese and tomato sauce. They were very patient whilst it was being baked and enjoyed their culinary delights!



## Butterfly Class

This week in Butterflies we loved our music and drama session with Whippersnappers. We participated in parachute games, played instruments and interacted with the hand puppets. We have also made flapjacks, choosing the ingredients to add to our oat mix.



## Bumblebee Class

This week Bumblebee Class has improved their cooking skills by mixing ingredients to do a delicious apple crumble. Children were delighted to experience mixing butter and flour together and feel how sticky it turned into. Bumblebee have also done really well in their maths session by matching colours with coloured bags and looking for shapes under textured paper.

We have continued to explore 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' story book alongside its props and smells.

## Gold Class

Pupils in Gold Class have been working on using their phonics to blend sounds and segment words to read. Pupils are learning the sound of letters and blending them together to make words. Children challenge themselves to make new words by changing one sound and finding different words with the sounds they know.



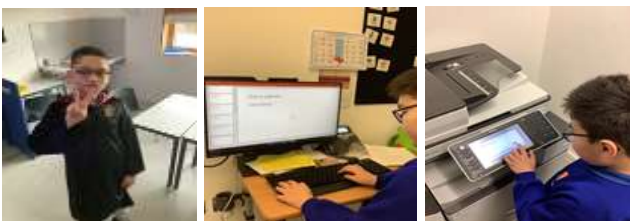
## Silver Class
