They learned the symbols, sign language and the emotions related to each one of the Zones.



#### **Green Class**

Green Class had fun with Mr Ruffles the entertainer this week. They danced, helped to do some magic and played some music for songs by shaking bells and shakers. They also enjoyed the snowstorm at the end.



# **Orange Class**

In Orange Class, wellbeing and independence were the main focus. Pupils have demonstrated their ability to initiate interaction with adults in different ways. We have also learned how to sequence movements and actions and discuss how we can improve what we do.

This week we have been working on literacy and ICT. Pupils have been reading stories, answering questions and using the class laptops to complete and extend our work. Pupils in Rainbow Class have also been
