School News

Red Class

This week the children have done especially well achieving their PLIMs targets.

We enjoyed making bread in our cooking session.

The children are helping to look after the stick insects by spraying their leaves with water.



Pink Class

'Water, water all around', has been the vibe this week in Pink Class. We started our week by mixing paint colours and using sand to make beautiful ocean sunset paintings. We have also been making the most of the weather by getting lots of water play in and using water to squirt each other as part of our sensory story this week!



Yellow Class

Yellow Class children have been exploring water with containers. We added bubbles and other elements to encourage exploration which develops concentration and hand-eye coordination.

The children enjoyed using the iPads with different educational programs. They have learnt to activate the games with the movement of their fingers on the touch screen.



Blue Class

In Blue Class this week, children have been working to develop their fine motor skills and letter formation skills. Children have used traditional writing tools to overwrite letters of the alphabet. They have also enjoyed making marks in paint, inserting pegs into a peg board and cutting using an adapted pair of scissors. Well done!



Orange Class

This has been a very busy week in Orange Class. In maths, we learned about money and the children had opportunities to familiarise themselves with different coins. They learnt to count and sort them according to their abilities.

During our weekly shopping trip, the children learned how traffic lights work and some were able to press buttons to activate them. We also focused on individual targets.



Ladybird Class

Ladybird Class has had a fantastic week. We enjoyed a picnic as part of our story *Shark in the Park* and also a water play activity. The children enjoyed reading the story together and used their own methods of communication to join in. We made chocolate cake in cooking and enjoyed eating it for snack.



Rainbow Class

Rainbow Class had a good week. We learnt more about stop-motion animation themed around plastic waste in the ocean. We also focused on maths, learning more about

subtraction and patterns. We are going on a trip to the zoo today.



Green Class

In Green Class we have enjoyed making and eating fruit kebabs. The children chose their favourite fruits to add.



Purple Class

This week in Purple Class we have been taking part in an art project to try and understand the effects of plastic rubbish in the ocean. We have also been conducting science experiments to see what melts ice the fastest.



Butterfly Class

In Butterfly Class we created a circus tent this week. We dressed and behaved as clowns, we activated switch operated lights and we made circus snacks such as popcorn. We really enjoyed our pretend trip to the circus.



Gold Class

Gold Class has had a fantastic week learning about the seaside and what we can see at the beach. We made sandcastles and decorated them with different coloured sand and glitter. We keep on practising our phonics and learning new words!



Silver Class

This week Silver Class children have been developing mathematical thinking skills. Pupils have been joining in with rote counting up to thirty. Pupils have also recognised numerals from one to 20 and have begun to understand that each represents a constant number or amount, e.g. putting the correct number of objects (1 – 20) into containers marked with the numeral. For the CREATE project pupils have been developing their awareness of the impact of plastic on our ocean. Children have been exploring a range of materials and their effects on marine life.
