Thank you to all parents, carers and family members who came to Sports Day this week. It was lovely to see you and have you participate in the fun with your child(ren). By now, you should know what class your child(ren) will be in for September. At Livity, compiling class groups is not as straight forward as mainstream schools. This does take time and special consideration from therapists – including the School Nurse, Speech and Language Therapist and School Doctor.

Today, your child(ren) should come home with a summer social story and calendar. If they are not in school, this will come home next week. Please keep this in a safe place where you will be able to refer to it daily over the next seven weeks. These are designed to be read through daily together and then to cross out each date signifying 'holiday' or 'school'. 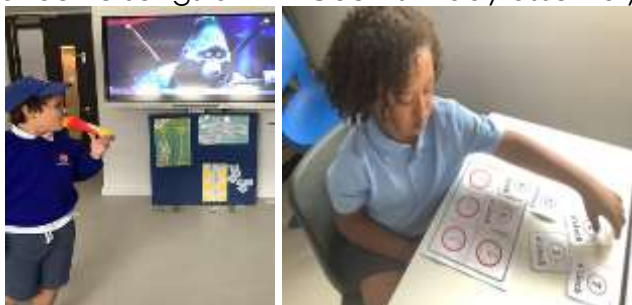
Silver Class

Continence product supplies information

Aka Pads, Pampers, diapers, nappies

Children are eligible for a continence assessment and may be eligible for products from the age of 5yrs. In some cases where the child is a wheelchair user or unable to weight bear, this may be from 4yrs.
